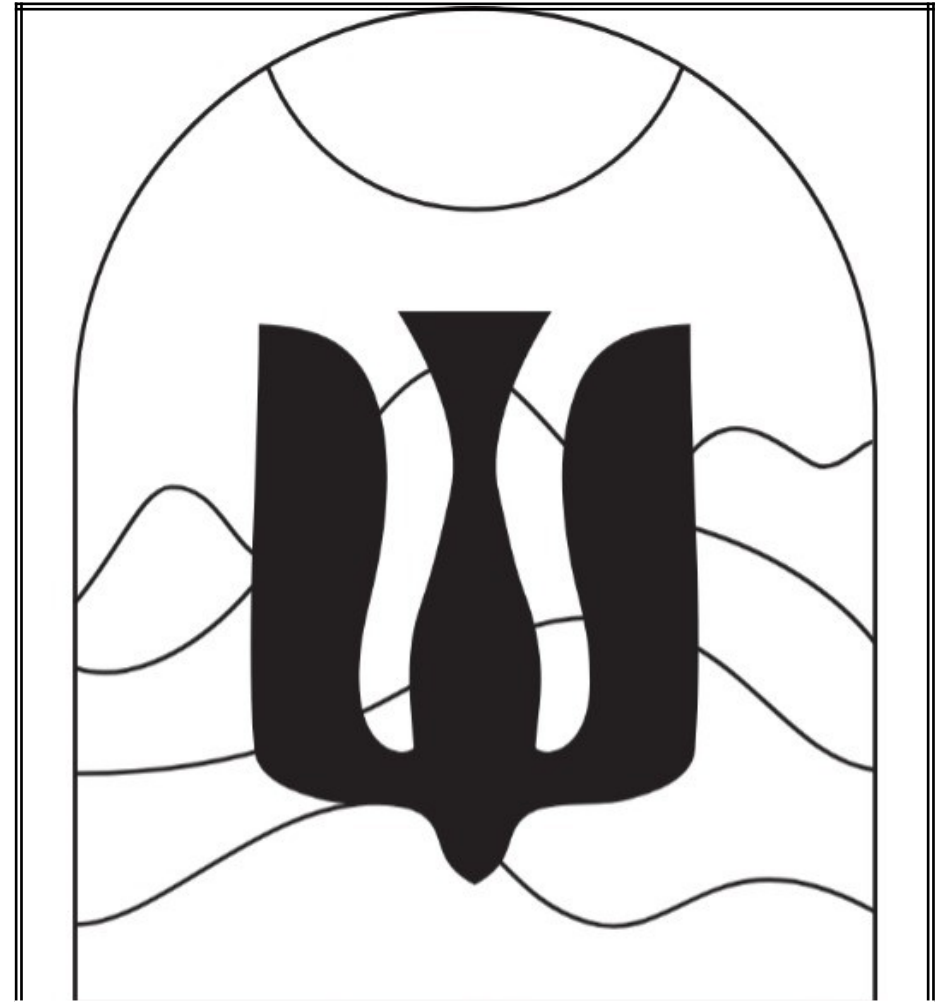
## TODAY'S SERVICE
