SOUPER BOWL OF CARING 2022

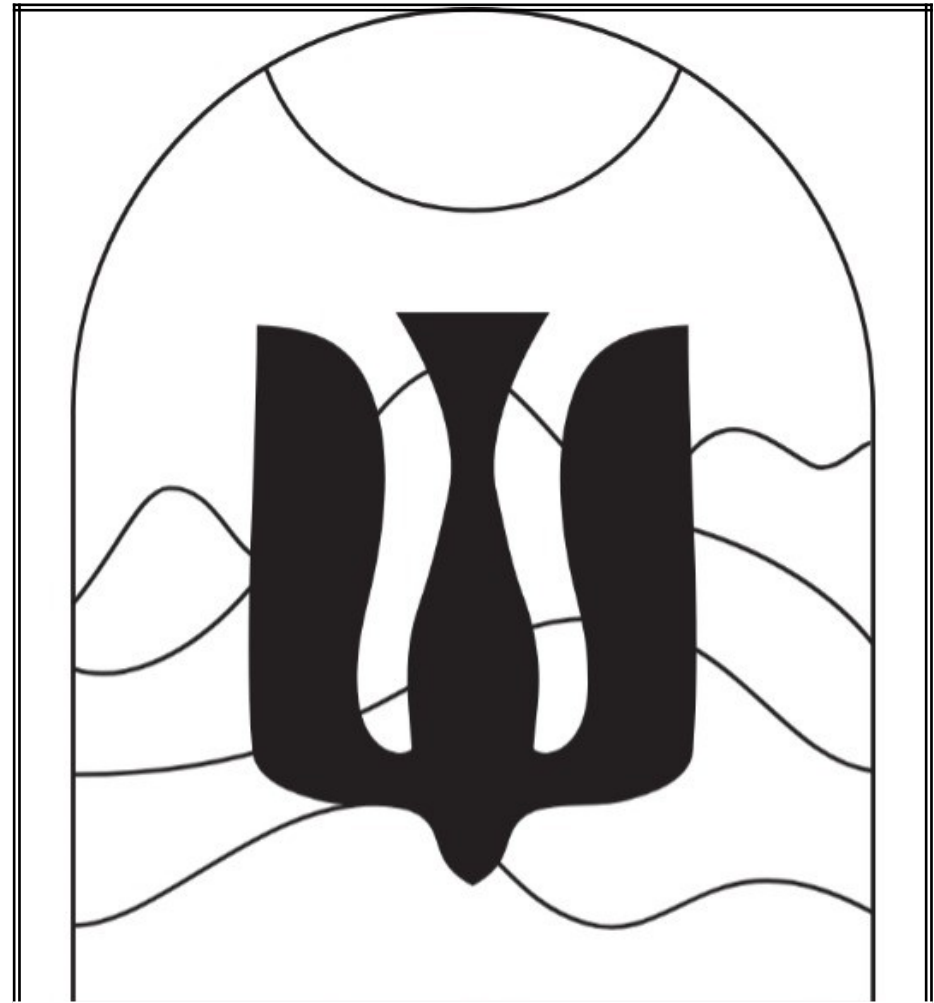
